



# Equality Objectives

Statement 2025 -2029

At Western House Academy, our staff are committed to equality. We aim to provide equal opportunities for all within our school community – children, staff, parents and carers, regardless of gender, religion, race, belief, disability, or socio-economic background.

We do this by:

- Ensuring that everyone in school is treated fairly and with respect.
